### Who is behind the call?

- NORFACE network (New Opportunities for Research Funding Agency Cooperation in Europe)
  - → Wellbeing call
- CHANSE (Collaboration of Humanities and Social Sciences in Europe) is a collaborative program for 27 research funders from 24 countries
  - → manages the call on European level
- FORTE and the SWEDISH RESEARCH COUNCIL participants in the NORFACE network
  - → finances and administers granted Swedish projects in the call

## 18 countries participate in the call:

Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Estonia, France, Germany, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Poland, Romania, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, United Kingdom

## What is the call about?

The purpose of the call is to enhance well-being for the future and to make these improvements sustainable for all groups in the population.

Applications must concern one or preferably several of the following topics, which are described in detail in the call text on CHANSE's website:

- 1. Crises, challenges and well-being
- 2. Environmental challenges and well-being
- 3. Well-being and mental health
- 4. Well-being, economy and politics

### **Process and criteria**

- Two-stage call for international research projects.
- Project duration 24–36 months.
- Maximum budget for a consortium project is 1,500,000 euros.
- 4-6 participating countries per consortium.
- You can only be project manager (PI)/project coordinator (PL) for one application.



 A consortium application may be rejected, if one of the participants does not meet national criteria.

# **Funding**

- Management and administration of the call on international level is cofunded by the European Commission. However, there is no co-funding for granted research projects in this call.
- All countries finance their own shares of the consortium project based on their national rules and eligibility criteria, therefore it is very important to ensure that everyone in the consortium follows their national rules.
- Forte and the Swedish Research Council funds the granted Swedish applicants in the call. The total Swedish budget for this call is 15 million Swedish crowns.
- Swedish applicants in a consortium can apply for a maximum of 2 million SEK/year (regardless of how many researchers participate).

## National submission in Prisma

 After submitting a consortium application in the Chanse portal EPSS, all Swedish applicants must also submit a national application in Prisma (it will open later, after deadline in Chanse portal).



- The application in Prisma only concerns the Swedish sub-project and the budget for it. The application can be written in English, except for the title and Swedish summary.
- Please, calculate your budget first in Swedish crowns and then convert to
  euros (use exchange rate for a day when you fill in the budget sheet). Grants
  will be paid in Swedish crowns by Forte, therefore it is more important that
  your budget is correct in SEK.
- Please, use Currency converter: <u>Valutaomräknare Prova vår</u> valutaomvandlare | Danske Bank.
- The main applicant and co-applicant(-s) must have a doctoral degree latest by the call deadline in Chanse portal September 21<sup>st</sup> 2023.
- The main applicant must be affiliated to an organisation that is approved by Forte as a fund administrating organisation.
- An administrating organisation is a legal person, a research practitioner with a Swedish organization number.
- Results of research must be published with open access. Forte does not normally cover costs for publication, access via Bibsam.

## **Common questions & answers**

- Forte's financial rules for project grants apply. No co-financing is required, and the Swedish part of the project grant is intended to provide full cost coverage including OH. You can use calculation model for OH at your fund administrating organisation.
- It is important that budget for the Swedish sub-project does not exceed 2
  million SEK/year and that the sums in euros and Swedish kronor are the
  same on total.
- If you use *subcontracting* in the consortium application, it must go under the heading *Wages* or *Data processing* in Prisma.
- In your application in Prisma, you should only include the Swedish part of the project (project manager, co-applicant, summary, budget).
- Budget does not need to be "devided". What you have filled in the budget sheet at Chance portal for years 1, 2, 3, you fill in at Prisma portal for the years 2024, 2025, 2026 in SEK. Payment year does not always correspond to project time.
- We do not reimburse costs for personal computers or other normally occurring office equipment, they will be extracted from costs in your application.
- Forte does not require a Letter of Commitment from Swedish applicants in Prisma. However, it is obligate to have LoC in your consortium application if you have cooperation partners in your project.
- The application will open in Prisma approximately one week after the deadline in Chance EPSS, therefore the announcement is not visible in the selection menu in Prisma.
- All co-applicant researchers in the Swedish sub-project must have their own account in Prisma. Principal applicant (project leader) invites co-applicant researchers to the application in Prisma.
- In the application in Prisma, you must attach a pdf-file of the consortium application. You can download it from Chanse EPSS a few days after the deadline.
- Researchers from other countries can participate in your project as
  cooperation partners, either with their own funding or as paid consultants. It
  must first be approved by your fund administrating organisation, which then
  also will have to distribute funding to the cooperation partner. Furthermore,
  researchers (cooperation partners) from foreign countries must obtain
  approval from their university as well that they can participate in a project
  abroad, e.g., in Sweden.



You have to describe in your application what added value a cooperation
partner or consultant brings to your project and what specific knowledge do
they have.
